PUBLIC RECORDS & PROTECTED ADDRESSES

Thank you for requesting information on how to protect your information in the City of St. Petersburg records. Under Florida's broad public laws we must make public records, which may include property ownership information, available to the public. Florida Statutes provides a limited list (below) of individuals who may qualify to have their home addresses, phone numbers and in some cases additional data to be protected in our records. *The categories listed below are abbreviated due to space limitations. For complete details of qualifications, please refer to Section 119.071, Florida Statutes.*

- A person who has been the victim of sexual battery, aggravated child abuse, aggravated stalking, harassment, aggravated battery, or domestic violence, with official verification that an applicable crime has occurred (5-year renewable exemption from date of request).

Current and Former:

- All law enforcement personnel, including correctional and correctional probation officers.
- Personnel of the Department of Children and Families whose duties include the investigation of abuse, neglect, exploitation, fraud, theft, or other criminal activities.
- Personnel of the Department of Health whose duties are to support the investigation of child abuse or neglect.
- Personnel of the Department of Health whose duties relate to social security benefit determinations, investigations of complaints against or inspection of healthcare facilities.*
- Personnel of the Department of Revenue or local governments whose responsibilities include revenue collection and enforcement or child support enforcement.
- Justices of the Supreme Court, district court of appeal judges, circuit court judges, and county court judges.
- State attorneys, assistant state attorneys, US attorneys*, assistant US attorneys*, statewide prosecutors, or assistant statewide prosecutors.
- Human resource, labor relations, or employee relations directors, assistant directors, managers, or assistant managers of any local government agency or water management district whose duties include hiring and firing employees, labor contract negotiation, administration, or other personnel-related duties.
- Code enforcement officers.
- Guardians ad litem, as defined in Section 39.820, Florida Statutes*.
- Department of Juvenile Justice employees: juvenile probation officers, juvenile probation supervisors, detention superintendents, assistant detention superintendents, juvenile justice detention officers I and II, juvenile justice detention officer supervisors, juvenile justice residential officers, juvenile justice residential officer supervisor I and II, juvenile justice counselors, juvenile justice counselor supervisors, human services counselor administrators, senior human services counselor administrators, rehabilitation therapists, and social services counselors.
- Public defenders, assistant public defenders, criminal conflict and civil regional counsel, and assistant criminal conflict and civil regional counsel.
- Investigators* or inspectors* of the Department of Business and Professional Regulation.
- Member of the Armed Forces of the United States, a reserve component of the Armed Forces of the United States, or the National Guard, who served after September 11, 2001.
- Personnel employed in an agency's office of inspector general or internal audit department.
- A certified emergency medical technician or paramedic.
- Firefighters certified in compliance with Section 633.408 Florida Statutes (360 hours of training).
- Impaired practitioner consultants
- Employees of a child advocacy centers and child protection teams that meet the requirements of Section 39.3035, Florida Statutes.

Current Only:

- County Tax Collectors*.
- General magistrates*, special magistrates*, judges of compensation claims*, administrative law judges of the Division of Administrative Hearings*, and child support enforcement hearing officers*.

* To qualify for protection of information, such individuals must have made reasonable efforts to protect information from being accessible through other means available to the public.
