

Q1 Overall, how satisfied were you with the overall application process?







Q5 Generally, how did you utilize the grant fund the business received? Select all that apply.






Q6 Is your business still in operation or plan to remain in operation?



Q7 How confident are you that your business will be able to do the following?




Q8 If current trends continued, how much longer do you expect your business could avoid permanent closure?


Q9 What are your top-three concerns with respect to returning to the workplace and/or operating in a changed business environment? (select top three)






Q12 During the current reopening phase, what percentage of revenue is your business experiencing compared to average revenue prior to COVID?
